 Hartog Elijah Hartog Elizabeth Mutter Esau and Matthea Lucy Ann
 and Patsy I leave their lives and enjoy for ever all my estate whether
 personal or mixed whether in action or possession of what some matter
 or kind so ever to be equally divided between them in consequence
 of the discharges and other misadvent of my grand daughter Elizabeth
 Hutcheson daughter of my Son Pleasant Hartog I do not wish her
 to have any part or portion of my estate whatever but when and when
 she is living by her father after his death I hereby discharge her from
 any liability on a account of the same. I have by appoint my Son
 Valentine Hartog executor of my estate of this my last will and testa-

 (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life
 and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased
 God to bless me with. I give and bequeath the same in manner following
 that is to say after the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses
 I give to my wife Polly Robertson the whole of my estate both real and
 personal for and during the term of her natural life and after her decease I give
 the same to my children equally to be divided among them and to be
 enjoyed by them for ever. I do hereby appoint & constitute my friends
 Samuel McCallister & James Addison Executors of this my last will
 and Testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments
 by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of December in the year of
 our Lord 1834

County Court June 15th 1835

The within writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Andrew Robertson was only proved by the oath of William Allison & Jordan Hale two of the two of the undersigned Wicks think who would swear that the within named Andrew Robertson signed sealed and acknowledged the within writing as such for his last Will and Testament. That they solemnly believe that he was at the time of signing the same of sound mind and disposing memory, and that they subscribed their names Wicks think in his presence and the said Will was also sworn to in due form of law by Clement Wicks think one of the Executors therein named. And afterwards at a County Court held and held for the County of Buchanan at the Court house in Harrodsburg on Monday the 17th day of August 1835 the within Writing or Will was ordered to be recorded and thereupon the same is duly recorded in my office.

I told the Court of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky being dead of body but having my perfect understanding with the following distribution of my property. First, I give and bequeath to my two daughters Polly and Elizabeth each, one hundred dollars and husband to each of the above named also my horse cattle and hogs to be sold and the money to be equally divided between the above named. Secondly all of my land Farmhouse & other things to be sold and appraising my just debts expenses the balance to be equally divided between my four daughters viz Sally, Helen Elizabeth Wright Polly & Elizabeth each separately for their benefit.
