My last Will and Testament. Viz. I do give and will that should be my general Will of my property but that my should sell all such articles as she my choice to enable her to pay off all my just debts and that my said wife should also assist in the arrangement and settlement of all my business & that my said wife after having disposed of a much of my said estate as she shall see fit to accomplish the foregoing article it is my will that she have the entire & exclusive right to the residue not only for her own support but for the raising & maintaining of the children now living with her.
