

I Charles Waller of the Town of Cloverport Breckinridge County Kentucky do hereby make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows To Wit

First. It is my Will and desire that so much of my personal property as consist of household furniture, Beds Bedding &c be set apart to my Wife Martha Waller provided she desires to have the same for house Keeping. All the remainder of my personal property I desire sold so soon as my Executor can do so conveniently without loss to the estate, and after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses I desire all the balance of the money arising from the sale of said property to be invested by my Executor in the best paying and safest Bonds then on the Market.

Second - I give to my Wife Martha Waller besides the aforesaid articles mentioned in first section the family Residence, where I now reside during her single lifetime provided she desires to keep the same for purpose of house keeping, I would however herein advise my Wife to have the said house & lot sold by my executor and the Money arising from same to be also invested in Bonds but should she desire to keep the same during her single life time she can do so and at the expiration of the same I hereby empower my Executor to sell and convey the same and invest the money as aforesaid. And I desire that she shall have all the interest arising from the bonds bought with the Money arising from the sale of the personal property and also from the real estate if sold. And my executor are hereby authorized & empowered to ~~pay~~ pay over the to her in quarterly installments during her single life time - It is my desire that should my Wife Martha Waller ~~not~~ prefer not to keep house, she is to have such household furniture &c as she may desire to fit up a room for her own convenience the balance to be sold & money invested as the other.

Third - Should my ^{Wife} again Marry, I desire that the interest arising from said Bonds, should cease to be paid to her during her intermarriage, and shall be appropriated to the education of my Sister Children, but should my Wife again lose by death or otherwise, her husband she shall in that case be entitled to two thirds of the interest arising from said Bonds, and at the death of my Wife I desire one half of the interest on said bonds to be paid to my Father & Mother, or if one be dead to the one living and the other half of said interest to go the education of my Sister Children, and in case of the death of my Father & Mother both I desire all to be appropriated to the education my Sister Children - until the youngest one shall be of age then I desire the principle to be divided equally between them

but in no case shall it be legal for one of the said Children to trade off their interest before the allotment of the same.

Lastly - I do hereby constitute my Brother Friedrich Hatten and my Friend Morris Baldorf Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former Wills by me made and I hereby empower my executors to execute this my last according to law except they shall not be required to settle with the Court only every five years after the first settlement.

I hereby appoint my wife Elizabeth as Executor to this my last Will and request the Court to not require any security of her and I further more require that my property shall not be appraised this 27th day of August 1867
