

Know all men by these presents that I Cornelia Claycomb, of the County of Breckinridge, and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing Judgment, and believing that men should make such disposition of their worldly effects as to them may seem fit and proper therefore this to be my last will and Testament as follows,

First, After my funeral expenses and all other just debts are paid I want my beloved wife Sarah, to have my Servant Mary (Marian) with Saddle Bredle &c. My Son Marion to have my Bay Mare (Jill) with Saddle Bredle &c. My Son Harrison to have the Brown Mare (Jill) with Saddle Bredle &c. & My son William & to the young Servant Hester (Jack) with Saddle Bredle &c. & My youngest son John I to have the black (Alem) with Saddle Bredle &c. and it is my further desire that my wife make what disposition of the left given to her as she may feel disposed for his interest, and the old Servant Mary to be left for the benefit of the above named, so long as they remain together, and in case they should separate, she shall be sold for the mutual benefit of all.

Second, I also leave to my wife Sarah and to my respective sons Marion, Harrison, William & and John Franklin Claycomb, one hundred and eighty dollars each, with the addition of one hundred dollars to John Franklin Claycomb, my youngest son, the one hundred dollars left to John, and last named it be paid by his Mother, for his sake or support.

Third, It is further my will and desire that whatever money accrue to my estate, from the Tobacco now sold and past delivered, or any that may come in from any source the 1st day of May to be divided equally between my wife and Children before named by my Executors hereafter named.

Fourth, the balance of my estate both real and personal to be divided and disposed of according to Law, leaving it to my wife John to take a third, as the law allows, or a child part in for simple.

Fifth and lastly, It is my request and desire that my Brother William C. Claycomb, and my Son Marion Claycomb, be my Executors, to carry the foregoing provisions of this will into operation and effect. In Testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this 10th day of April 1839.
