

I David Weatherford of the County of Brackenridge & State of Kentucky - being in usual health & sound mind & disposing memory do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament -

First - I desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid.

Secondly - My son Charles Weatherford having moved upon my farm at my request, for the purpose of contributing to the comfort of myself & wife in our old age - I believe it to be just & proper to make out of my estate a provision for him, as some compensation for his conduct & sacrifice in the matter, and I therefore devise to the said Charles Weatherford the tract of land on which I now live - near the town of Hardinsburg, being the same I purchased from Hon. John Calhoun dec'd with the exceptions of some parts I have heretofore sold to have and to hold the same to him & his heirs forever. But in case my wife survives me, the said Charles is to support her comfortably during her life and this devise is to be regarded in the light of a charge upon the land. I further intend that any debts I may be owing at my death shall be paid by the said Charles Weatherford & shall also constitute a charge upon the land hereby devised.

I further devise all the net residue of my estate, to my other children & grand children the grand children taking such interest in the same as their father or mother would be entitled to if living. The grand children representing their ancestor - and dividing an equal share among them - of this division my son Charles is to have no part as the devise of the land with the charges annexed is what I intend him to have.

I hereby appoint my son Charles Weatherford as executor of this my last Will & Testament -

And revoke all other Wills heretofore made by me In Testimony whereof I hereby subscribed my name & affix my seal this 18th day of June 1868

personal property be sold and appropriated to the sole
use and benefit of the Family grave yard and Amb-
Stones set in such names as may hereafter be mentioned
by my Executors, and after all expenses is paid the
remainder, I will and bequeath to the Lawful heirs of
of Brother Joseph Walls and to the heirs of my sister
Judith B. Earley or to so many of them as may be
living at my decease. Likewise I make constitute
and appoint Peysen, Scott & Wm W. Dyer Executors of
this my Last will and Testament hereby revoking all
