I also will and bequeath unto my well beloved son Thomas Nathaniel Williams one horse creature to be his proper right I also will and bequeath unto my grandson Thomas Williams One bed and furniture also one cow and calf to be in the ~~care~~ of his father until he come to the age of 21 then to be his proper right I do also will and bequeath unto my son Samu'el Williams one year old boy I also give unto my daughter Sophia Hannah one year old boy I also after paying all my ~~known~~ debts the remaining part of my property to be equally divided between my children Ann Williams Elizabeth Williams Thomas J. Williams and Chitty Ann Williams after my wife taking one third I ~~heavily~~ appoint my wife Sally Williams my sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former will by me made In witness whereof I have ~~hereto~~ set my hand and seal this 15th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and - five sealed and signed and
