present Estate shall bear the disposal of Eliza my Wife during her lifetime
but in case she shall marry again my Will is that she shall have nothing. My Will
is that my Wife shall also have and possess my real Estate during her lifetime
my Will then is that my real Estate shall be equally divided between my
three Children (viz) Mary Elizabeth, Sarah Annwright and Edna Wilson. My Will
is that Charles Hawkins shall act as my Executor. This being my last will and testament
I signing all other signs and acknowledgments this 25th day of March 1840 in presence of

Mount Merine Wundersing County Kentucky 15th day of September one thousand
and eight hundred and forty.

I Edward Willis Powell being of sound mind and disposing memory make
this my last will & testament. I constitute my Mother next to and after my death to
dispose of I donate to St Joseph's College at Washington two hundred
and fifty dollars being a part of a note I hold on them the balance of \$4. note I
donate to the same of Mount Merine Seminary.

To my Nephew Willis Lee I donate
three hundred and forty acres of land in the County of Jackson Missouri I have
him also my gold watch, all my clerical books and sacred testaments together
with one hundred dollars in money I leave to John M. Buchanan my Coadjutor
In case said Willis Lee becomes a clergyman he is to have said Books and
testaments. My black girl babe I leave to my Mother during her natural lifetime
then to pass to her legal heirs To my Sister Polly Lee I leave my black boy John during
her life and to pass to her children at her death. My black boy George I leave

to my sister Sally McManus during her natural life and to pass to her children at her death. I have in my pocket Book a good hundred dollar bill & some fifty dollars in gold all the other money in the bank on it this belongs to the person.

I have to Mr. Mathews say which interest proper and purchase of the Mount
Vernon establishment with the debt and does owing to the S^d establishment with all
its encumbrances debt & does without any lien on my part for any deficiencies
the said Mathews are to pay over to my authorized agents as he has mentioned the sum
of something over two thousand dollars being the amount paid in by me in eight
annual & equal instalments the payment of the first instalment to be made on the first
day of January 1842 with interest after the first payment for which the S^d
Mathews are to execute Bonds with Security.

I devote to Mary D. Powell one thousand Dollars out of the above amount to be paid to her in eight annual instalments as above mentioned and to be held by her during her natural life and to pass to her heirs.

I do devise to Eliza Smith five hundred dollars in like payments to be like and paid as above mentioned. Lee & McManis are to collect the interest of the above two thousand dollars & to pay over the same to their children respectively according to their severals as they come to maturity. The other two thousand dollars being my profits on the establishment up to the present time they the said Mathews are to pay to the said Lee & McManis in eight annual and equal instalments, one eighth thereof becoming due on the first day of January 1842. The said Lee and McManis are to give receipts to their respective several heirs for the faithful management of the 8th month to be paid over to my sister children as they come to maturity. I also devise to each of my several family slaves out of any money belonging to my Estate.

I have moreover appointed Mr. Lee and Mr. Mann as Executors of this my last Will and Testament. I wish my body to be interred in the Church-yard at Hardonsburg, the manner hereof to be left to Mr. R. Mathews the expenses to be disburged out of any Monies belonging to my Estate. May God have Mercy on my Soul and Testamentary which I have written signing here with my Seal.
