Allen who severally swore they were well acquainted with the hand writing of Richard Stephens. that they had frequently seen him write and that they verily believed the signatures to the Codicil to be in the said Richard Stephens hand writing and thereupon the said Will & Codicil and ordered to be recorded

I Eliza Murray of Buckenridge County and State of Kentucky and one of the children and heirs of Joseph Baston dec^d. knowing it is appointed and for all to do. do make this my last will & testament as follows: to wit:

Altho my father died seized and possessed of a considerable landed property amongst which was a tract of land on the Ohio River on the upper side of lower branch and at the mouth thereof part of which was laid off as a town and then called & known by the name of Lewisville now called Brownport a chart or plan of which is recorded in the County Court of Buckenridge County and in a division of the lands amongst the children & heirs of Joseph Baston dec^d. who died intestate the above mentioned town lots with other lands was allotted to Mrs Eliza

Murray as will more fully appear by reference to the deeds of purchase. A deed of purchase in Buckenridge County Court, and my husband David M. Murray having with his family settled in the said town of Blountport and this landy note which have been improved and as I deem it of importance to my husband & children that the town should improve. In case of my death, it is my wish and desire that my husband David M. Murray (in whom I have full confidence that he will execute the trust fully confided to him to the best advantage for my children) shall have full power and authority to execute deeds of conveyance for all lots whithersoever and which he may hereafter wish to sell or lease all or any of the in said town and do any act which he may deem necessary and which in his opinion may be necessary to promote the interest of the town and at every deed or deed made by him conveying all or any of the lots in said town & it is my wish and desire that they pay the legal title to the lots thereby intended to be conveyed to the purchaser or purchasers from me here as if done by myself in my lifetime. I hereby appoint my husband David M. Murray the Executor of my last will and testament during his life or until my children arrive at the full age of twenty one years but in case he should die before my children all arrive to the age of 21 years then and in that event I hereby appoint my Executors E. C. Bartlett & E. C. Bartlett Executors of this my last will & testament hereby authorizing each of them so may act with full power and authority to act either jointly or severally as they may find it convenient or necessary to do so without the consent of the other party but with the consent of my said husband by his will.
