examined In the name of God Amen: I Elizabeth Ann Walterm Burbach, of the Co of Breckenridge and State of Kentucky, being of sound mine (now) and of reasonable bodily health, and knowing the uncertainty of life and that it is appointed unto all to die, and wishing to establish my son Watty Scott Clark in a permanent home on this farm known as the Mt Alba Farm as a recompense to him for his filial care and protection, unto me now in the decline of life, he cares for and nurses me in sickness and provides me with all needful necessaries of life and all the comforts I ask for or need, and wishing to dispose of my property do make this my last will and testament.

To my son Watty S. Clark I will and devise One Hundred and fifty acres of land, to be surveyed to him in one lot or both, on any part of the farm he may direct or desire to have surveyed to him which lot of land shall include the Mansion House with Parns inclusive.

I also give him all the stock of every kind I may have on the farm at my death (after enough has been sold to pay my funeral expenses)

Also I give him all the household and kitchen furniture with all the bedding, except the beds and bed clothing sufficient for two of them. I give him two beds and one young with all the bed clothing I have given him.

To my son William S. Clark I will and devise fifty acres of land to be surveyed to him in one lot or both, on any part of the farm he may desire or direct so that it does not run into W. S. Clark's survey as provided above.

and as to the rest of my land now owned by me

or the remainder of the farm I will and devise the same unto my other five children or ~~their~~ heirs to be equalize divided between them to Hartman W. Bumpers heirs one equal part, to each of the other four one equal part Minnie W. Kehely Mary A. Nelson. Jennie M. Ball and Joshua S. Babbage my son, and lastly in the name of God I pray the Breckinridge Court to carry out my wishes as devised and bequest in this will to the letter. I have written this my last will and testament with my own hand and pray the Court to allow it probate, as witness my hand this 28th July 1886.
