these presents that I Francis Hargy make this my last will and Testament
First I wish that at my just debts shall be paid and buried and burial expenses
paid. Secondly I want my two Sisters Lucretia and Martha my riding horse and
wishes to be equally divided between them as a special legacy & as well as the
last thing I want my ^{little} sister Eliza Hargy to have my saddle as a special
legacy more than the other two then I wish. I wish all the rest of my Estate
consisting of money, Bonds, Notes and accounts should be equally divided between
my sister Sister & Brothers. Also I want my Sister Eliza & her daughter Eliza
to have an equal part with the rest. Thirdly I want my Brother Thomas as
sole guardian for Eliza and managed her part of the estate in the following
manner First I want her money to be loaned out at interest till she
is Eighteen years old or till she gets married provided she marries before that time
then I want her to have her money with interest then on also I wish her
to be schooled and her tuition paid out of her part of the Estate
Lastly I want a division to take place at least within two months if possible
or as soon after as the nature of the case will admit of after my death and each one
to take his part and manage it to his own liking except Eliza her I want
managed in the above named manner. At Witness I here with Subscribed
