I Elmore A. Wedder knowing it is appointed unto all men once to die and believing it a duty while living to make such disposition of all my estate, both personal and real for my heirs and administrators may be at as little trouble as possible and being of sound mind and disposing memory yet in bad health make this my last will and testament.
First it is my will after my decease that all my funeral expenses shall be paid with all just debts I may be owing at that time.
I do appoint my son Fletcher Mercer my administrator with such power

to sell & convey, make deeds & every other
requirements that may be necessary
in settling up my estate and do
ask of the Court to require no secu-
rity of him as I believe he will do his
duty as may be required of him
without security.

3rd Third it is my will after all my
debts are settled & paid off that all
my estate both personal & real shall
be equally divided between all my
children viz: - Elizabeth Whitcomb
Amanda Duncan, Jane Malin
Clotcher Mercer & Elvester Mercer to
all the above I set my hand & seal
in the presence of the undersigned
witnesses this 3rd day of December 1874.
