Examineth and Margaret A. Scott of The town of Cloverport,
County of Breckenridge and State of Kentucky,
widow, being of sound mind and disposing memory,
and being fully conscious of the uncertainty of life
and the certainty of death, do make, publish and
declare this my last will and Testament, in manner
and form as follows, that is to say.

1st I give and devise to my daughter Jennie Jabine,
now a widow, a certain lot or parcel of ground
situated in the town of Cloverport, County of Brecken-
ridge and State of Kentucky, fronting on Huston
Street 100 feet and running back 200 feet on Third
Cross Street, marked and known on the plan or
map of said town as No. 42 (I have heretofore by deed
conveyed to her and her children, a lot of the same
size upon which her residence now stands adjoining
it on the North and fronting on High Street marked as
aforesaid as No. 33.) It being my intention that this
daughter shall have these two lots No 33, heretofore

Brashear Lot No. 32, 100 by 200 feet the same on which
my residence now stands fronting on High Street
and adjoining No. 33, with the dwelling and all
its other appurtenances.

I also give and devise to her the lot immediately in the
rear of No. 32, fronting on Huston Street, marked
on the plat of said town as No. 43, and is the
same on which the stable now stands.

3^d I give devise and bequeath to my two daughters
aforesaid to wit. Jennie Jabine and Anna M. Brashear
all the remainder of my estate, real, personal and
mixed, and of every nature whatever, which I may own
at my death, to be divided equally between them.
Each is to take her share in fee simple, and may
dispose of it as each may deem proper.
