I now be I will my soul to God who gave it and my body to the burial in decency and after settling my just demands I have ~~bequeathed~~ bequeathed to the Widow of my eldest son and his personal to be taken care of in his own manner. I then I will and bequeath unto my beloved Son John A. Barr 120 acres of land more or less and to me by John Barron and I his and his heirs and also a share of John Barron's. I will and bequeath unto my Son and daughter 200 acres of land more or less and to me by John Barron and his heirs and his heirs in March County and also one house and lot. I then I will and bequeath unto my youngest son George who has my house plantation when he becomes of age or marries with the exception of my wife, say my whole estate to be administered by his executors and the above named George to have a house and lands equal to the share of John when he becomes of age. I then I will that if either of the above named daughters should die without an heir that the part left to her shall be equally divided between my four daughters, Mary, Hannah, Sarah and Malinda. I then I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Barr my negro woman and all my tools and furniture wharves and the right of control during her natural life or widowhood and at the expiration either to be divided between the above named four daughters after Hannah and Sarah and Malinda have married as much as Mary that is married. I then I will and bequeath all my dear notes and will to be equally divided between my four above named daughters making one equal to the share and if either of the above named daughters should die without an heir the part left to her to fall back and be divided between the surviving children. I then I heavily appoint Elias Barr and Jonathan P. Branch as my Executors. I do testify when I have heard with all my hand and that this 10th day of April 1846.
