Bruner from also four head of horses seven head of cattle thirty head of hogs seven head of sheep The farming utensils that we now have on hand belonging to the farm all her right in the household furniture kitchen furniture &c &c and all other property she the said Charlotte Bruner claims. To him the said Zachariah Bruner his heirs or assigns for ever. The consideration of the above is this the said Zachariah Bruner is to support me in life in a comfortable manner so far as it is convenient for him. In testimony I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 1846
