

In the name of God I Benjamin A Pate of the County of Buchanan being of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give to my dear love all my landed estate my son Allen Pate to have one hundred and twenty acres that I purchased of Richard Stennis my son Minor Pate to have one hundred and twenty more acres that I purchased of William Dawson bounded on one side by the north fork of Rough Creek also one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf and my wife and my son Thomas William Pate to have the place where I now live there being one hundred and thirty acres also one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf one shot gun and pistol my saddle and shoes more will let the rest of my property after paying my last debts to be equally divided between my wife Polly and all my children Polly Scott Allen Pate Melly Miller Nancy Shiffard Minor Pate Thomas William Pate Melly Miller daughter Eliza that I raised is to have one fourth of her mother's part I do hereby certify this to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of February Eighteen hundred and twenty five and take in the presence of us

At a County Court begun and held for the County of Buchanan at the Court house in Hardinsburg on Monday the 21st day of February 1825 The within writing was duly proved by the oaths of William Haynes & John Dawson subscribing witnesses who solemnly sworn in open Court that the within named Benjamin A Pate was deceased signed sealed published and declared the within writing to be his last will and testament that they believed that the said Benjamin A Pate at that time was of sound mind and disposing memory and that they subscribed their names as witnesses thereto in his presence and Henry Green & Henry Haynes the executors named in said will came into Court and declined taking upon themselves the executorship of said will and therefore the same is laid over for the appointment of a date And at a County Court begun and held for the County of Buchanan at the Court house aforesaid on Monday the 21st day of March 1825 W^o Polly Pate the widow of the said Benjamin A Pate doth come into Court and declined taking upon herself the burden of the administration of said estate and therefore on the motion of William Haynes & Nicholas Scott they are appointed administrators with the will annexed who took the oaths required by law and therefore the said Will is admitted to record
