Owen of the County of Breckenridge and state of Kentucky, being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say I give and bequeath to my Wife Melvina Owen the whole of my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be, which I give to her her heirs executors and assigns forever and I desire that none of my property be sold after my death with ^{the} exception of my present crop of tobacco which I think will pay all of my just debts and funeral expenses but if it should not, then that property which my wife Melvina shall designate. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Richard Hays executor of this my last will and testament. hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 5th of May in the year 1857
