Examined I George W Gregory of the county of Buchanan & State of Kentucky being now sick & weak of body but sound in mind & for which I thank God am calling to mind the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death & being desirous to make some disposition of such worldly good as it hath pleased God to bless me with I will first give & bequeath the same in this manner to wit (1st) I gave to my mother Sally Gregory all my estate both personal & real during her natural life to sell or to use after the same has been appraised (2nd) I gave to Minor S Gregory at the death of my mother forty two dollars & 50 cts (3rd) I gave unto Stephen Gregory at the above named time fifty two Dollars & 50 cts (4th) I also gave to Mrs Gregory my brother at the same time of the above forty two Dollars & 50 cts (5th) also to Washington Gregory infant son of Stephen Gregory at the same time above named one hundred & fifty Dollars provided the said Washington Gregory shall live to be twenty one years of age & in case he does not live to the age of twenty one years I then gave it & gave one hundred more than above named to my brother Stephen Gregory & twenty five more than above named to my brother Minor S Gregory & twenty five dollars to my brother Thomas Gregory

6th I want all my just debts which are small & funeral expenses paid by my mother as soon as practicable

7th I wish after the above is all paid out the balance of my

Estate if any shall be Equally Divided with minor S Thomas & Stephen Gregory with this Exception I hold a note on Thomas J Hall for Sixty four Dollars due 6th day of May 1833 which note I wish collected & Equally Divided with all my Brothers & Sisters or their heirs

Lately I appoint Sally Gregory my mother executrix of this my last will & Testament & ask it of the court not to require security of her for the performance of her duty as my Executrix I now Revoke all former wills heretofore made by me & declare this to be my last & Testament in the presence of this 12th day of April 1834 at Court
