my last will & testament revoking all others heretofore made
after the payment of my debts & decent burial of bequeath my estate
to my three sons Oscar, Alfred & John Wacker & direct its division
as follows: Item 1st I will to my sons Oscar & Alfred the farm in
Examined Brockenridge County upon which I now reside containing seven
hundred & forty one acres share & share alike. It is my wish that
they cultivate said farm as copartners until my youngest son
John Wacker shall arrive at age. The terms of partnership to
be equitable & they to free the terms Oscar is now the owner of one
half of all the stock of every description farming utensils
crops of every kind & every thing which has been purchased
for the use of said farm Oscar is to be charged in the settlement
of his wife's account with me as guardian for one half of all
the purchases made for the use & supplies of said farm. Also I give
to Oscar & Alfred my half of the property described above
together with the household & kitchen furniture - an inventory
to be taken & property valued & they to be charged with it. It is my
wish that they retain all my negroes upon the farm at a
reasonable hire paying one third of said hire to my youngest
son's guardian at the end of each year until John Wacker shall
arrive at age. Item 2nd I will to my youngest son John Wacker a
tract of land lying on the Ohio River in Lexington County Ky
containing one hundred & thirty acres the same I purchased
of Dr John Watson & wife I estimate this land at three
thousand dollars. The land devised to Oscar & Alfred I estimate
at ten thousand dollars there is yet due upon this land of the
purchase money three thousand four hundred dollars which
I direct that Oscar & Alfred shall pay & on the score of this land
they will be chargeable with six thousand six hundred dollars.
Item 3rd I will and direct my executors herein after named to invest
four thousand dollars in Louisville City bonds the interest of
to be appropriated appropriated to the support & education of
my son John Wacker & if this shall not be sufficient the deficiency
to be met by my general estate these bonds to be due as near the
time when my son John Wacker comes of age as possible. Item 4th
I will & devise that my executors shall keep at interest all the
money belonging to my estate until John Wacker arrive at age
at that time a general division shall take place charging each
with the above devises & in the division each of my sons to receive share
& share alike. Item 5th I hereby constitute & appoint my son Oscar
Board & my friend & relation Richard Watson executors of this
my last will & testament I appoint my relation John Wacker
guardian for my youngest son John Wacker Board given under my
hand & seal in Elizabethtown July 18th 1857
