Examined I Harvey Hays of Brokenridge County and state
of Kentucky being aiding no body but of sound mind
and disposing memory but fearing the uncertainty of
life and the certainty of death and believing it to be
the duty of every man to make such disposition of his
temporal affairs as he may desire to take place after his
death: He therefore make this my last will and testament
as follows: I do hereby place in the hands of my wife Eliza
Abels Hays the whole of my estate to keep and support
on during her widowhood, and for the support, rearing
and education of the younger child ren; But in case
she ever marries again I want my children to make a
sale and sell of my personal property and divide the
money between them as follows between them Mary
Conaway William Hays Sam Hays and Eliza Hays all of
these to have an equal part with this exception Mary
Conaway I have given a head head stead & clothing and
a cow and calf which is to be deducted out of her part
and John Hays is to have three hundred dollars more
than any of my children after the expiration of two
years and 6 months I want my two yard and two

acres of land around it to be sold to the highest bidder or privately as my wife may think best or more if my wife thinks best say sixty or seventy acres and after the death of my wife Elizabeth I want all my estate sold and divided as above directed. I want my wife Elizabeth Wags to be my Ex^{or} - x of this my last will and Testament and as I have more property than will pay my just debts I pray the Court to require of her no security. I also desire her to pay all of my just debts and to do so. she is required if necessary to sell any of the personal property to carry into effect this my last will and testament made and published this 25th of April 1851.

Examined In the name of God Amen. Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and the certainty of death do make and publish this my last will and testament.

First - I will that all my just debts ^{be} paid.

Secondly - I do will and bequeath to John W. Juggens and Sarah Juggens my first wife children one dollar a piece to be paid in six months after my decease.

Thirdly - I do will and bequeath to my two eldest children James Juggens and Hosea Juggens by my last wife one dollar a piece to be paid to them in six months after my decease.

Fourthly - I do will and bequeath to Letticy Juggens my second wife all of my property consisting of horses hogs sheep and cattle and all of my house hold and kitchen furniture together with my present crop of corn and tobacco to have and to hold the aforesaid personal property together with my soldiers right of prize for my services in the war of one thousand eight hundred & eleven to have and to hold the same during his widowhood.
