At Will Singleton D.C

This Indenture made this 8th day of February 1844

I Lewis Addison being in my right mind and ^{perfect} understanding
knowing ^{that} I am appointed ^{to} ~~and~~ ^{to} all men to die I do now make my last
Will & Testament. I Will to John Priest the orphan I have raised one
cow and bed and furniture. I Will to my Grandson George Addison my
youngest both and all the balance of my property consisting of Land
and Black Woman Mary, horses, butter, hogs, sheep, hound, hound, his
furniture to my wife Rebecca Addison her life time for her comfort
and benefit and after her decease if she should be the longest liver
I Will for my estate to be equally divided amongst my children
with the exception of my son in law Thomas Arbery to him I will
three dollars out of my estate. In testimony whereof I do set my
hand and seal at this my last Will and Testament.
