I Henry Walker of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky being advanced in life and Convinced of the uncertainty of its Continuance and of the necessity of Making such Provision as I deem Expedient for its termination do Make & Ordain in this My last Will and Testament viz 1st It is My Will and Desire that all My just debts be paid 2nd It is My Will now Deceased that My Beloved wife Elizabeth Walker to have equally the third of them & a Gap filled on the form by Helen B. Walker and Jerome Beaman agreeable to the Lease Made by me to them during the continuation of said Lease

3rd I Will that My wife have and dispose of all My house hold and Kitchen furniture as she chooses I have about Four hundred and fifty dollars in Cash and Cash Notes I Will that My Beloved wife have the Cash and Notes above named for her Support during her Natural life after her death what she May have of the above Property to be Equally divided between all My Children I make one Heir born which I Will and bequeath to Gordon A Walker My Grand Son

I Jacob Neff of Breckenridge County State of Kentucky being in
bad health but of sound mind and memory for which I am thankful
but considering the uncertainty of this life do make & ordain
this my last will and testament. Viz: I will and bequeath to my
daughter Sarah A Thomas and her husband Frances M. Thomas
fifty acres of land lying on the North side of the tract purchased
of Nehemiah Boards their running from Thos & Meadows line down
to pig branch to a cross fence. Thence up the cross fence to Pauls line.
Thence with Pauls line so as to include fifty acres. I also will &
bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Pauley and James Pauley her
husband, one hundred acres of land lying on the North West end
of the Henderson Board survey said land was run out by
Aaron Dresser in 1869 in corners and lines marked said Pauley still
owns two notes of \$100 each which he is to pay to my executor.
I will & bequeath to my son John Henry Neff twenty one acres
adjoining the Pauley tract and run out by Aaron Dresser at the
same time being a part of the Henderson Board purchase also
about fifteen acres lying on the N West of the Nehemiah
Board survey & laying on the North side of the Newbyville & Neff
mill road be the same more or less & I further bequeath to my
beloved wife Rose Ann Neff & the other five children the remainder
of my lands & all of my personal effects for their use & benefit & at
the death of my wife to be equally divided between my five children
Viz: Geo. H. Neff, Adrian A. Neff, Jacob Neff, Gunder Neff and
Barbara Neff. I further appoint my son Adam A. Neff my executor
to settle up all of my business and request that Adam shall have
the contrall of all the property both real & personal while my beloved
wife may live. In witness whereof I have set my hand this 10th
day of March 1870
