Knapp of the County of Gloucestershire and State of Kentucky being my last and only son of Sound and disposing mind and this my last will and Testament in manner following I do then It is my wish that my just debts be paid out of my estate Item I do will and bequeath my estate consisting of my interest in two Negroes Linn and Henry deceased and all the Estate also my interest in the house held on by my father also my land & premises to my sister Sarah Knapp during her natural life Item I do will and bequeath to my brother John Knapp after the death of my Mother my interest in and unto the above said Negro Linn to have and he has his forever Item I do will and bequeath to my brother Samuel Knapp Polly Knapp Peggie Kirkmire and Rachel Knapp my interest in the Negro Girl I left my sister Sarah her life after the death of my Mother Sarah Knapp my desire is that my brother Samuel Knapp and sister above named have said Negro Girl during her life my interest in the tract of land that my Mother has on as Belts run by my father also my interest in the tract of every kind that I have interest in also all the money that may be owing to me from Samuel McCarty or John persons to be equally divided among them and their heirs forever with the increase of said Negro Girl Item I do For the love and comfort of my sister Polly Knapp and Rachel Knapp in my things I give and bequeath But forever and bequeath my Estate and all my being entitled to be equally divided between them between them and their heirs forever. 5th My wish is that the property I have left to my sister Kirkmire that she have and enjoy it during her life and to be equally divided among her children and said Henry Kirkmire is to have one Cow to be used it in any way he is content in it 6th Item I do hereby appoint my brother John Knapp as my executor and my wife as my co executor and make constitute them and they my full heirs and assigns and I do moreover do in execution to this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 29th day of September 1835.
