Now all men by these presents that I Isaac Norton sign, of Buckner
County and State of Kentucky this day Being of sound mind and memory
and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and publish this
my last Will and Testament as follows. First I have given to each of my sons as
they become of age or shortly after one horse saddle and Bridle worth twenty
five dollars or more and fifty dollars in farming tools or other property or
cash to that amount. Secondly I have given to each daughter as they
become of age seventy five dollars in one cow and saddle and bed and bedding
house hold and kitchen ^{furniture} all but my youngest daughter Almira now it is
my will that she shall have the same amount as the other girls before
there is any further division and at the same prices one good cow at
eight dollars and other things like the other girls got I leave a small
memorandum book to show the price of all their things to have all
treated equally. Likewise Thirdly I give to my youngest son that is
now living Elijah M. Norton all my land that I now own provided
he lives with me and takes care of and provides all necessaries of
life for me and my wife our life time and Almira as long as she
lives single paying all Doctor bills and burying expenses if he
should chance to die before me and my wife the lands stands
good for our maintenance we are to hold full possession of all
right and privilege our life time at our death he takes full possession
right and title to remain and defend the same if I should die
before my wife I appoint her Administrator with out security to

divide out to each child alike at Both our deaths i want no date if i should dye clear of Debt i want the balance of my property if any is left divided equal Among all the children if they Cant agree let them chose three disinterested men to divide for them as witness my hand this 8th day of August 1865 -

In the name of God, Among I Henry G. Pile of the County of Breckinridge being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposed memory for which I thank my God, and Calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being disposed disposed of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath same as follows, to wit

I give to my three boys Christopher, Isaac, and John the farm in the valley buy them paying of the two thousand dollars in one and two years three years to pay it without interest and if they wont take the farm at that my testator will put it up and sell it just between my sons.

I desire that my executor make the infant and equal in part of their detestations with those that have already that has inured and left me one off against what they have already received,

After pay all just debts and funeral expense paid the balance to be equal divided between all my ans accept that which Christopher, Isaac and John pays for that farm then not entitled to no part of it goes to Francis, Susinda, George, Isaac, Mother, Isiah, Sister Ann if they take it at that price have no part in but every thing else equal,

Lastly I do hereby appoint and constitute my son Edward F. Pile Executor of my last will and testimony hereby revoking all other former will or testaments heretofore made by me heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
