This my last Will and Testament bearing date and date enclosed, made by me of what ever kind & title I have sent my nephew Henry Robertson the said Henry & every thing I possess after all my just debts paid & paid. The lot of my property of what ever kind I have granted to my nephew William C. Johnson his sister and my dear Anna Bessie Robertson. I wish that the said Henry Robertson have full use of the whole property for five years and that thereafter as in my place in the form of Annual Equal 1/6th and to enjoy all the profits that may arise there after having the use of all my power to carry on the business I have here free and unincumbered of any indebtedness of the land such as security or indemnity for its good management which in his hands. But in the event of any account or death happening here then the property to be all equally divided between the other three William and his sister Anna Bessie Robertson. Given from under my hand and seal this 15th April 1839

Be it remembered that on this tenth day of September in the year eighteen hundred and thirty nine. Personally appeared and came Hugh Lynch Esq. in open Court and presented the enclosed Last Will and Testament of Robert B. Menard and moved that the same be opened, proved and admitted to record. Whereupon the following persons were called before and to prove the said Will it being in the presence of Joseph M. Schindler, William C. Baptist, and M. L. McIlwain. Considered the Will and inhabitants of the Parish of Rapides who being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God. depose and say that they recognize the said Testament (here to annexed) as being entirely written, dated and signed in the Testator's hand writing, having often seen him write and sign during his lifetime and that they verily believe that the above said Testator Robert B. Menard is dead. Given to and subscribed before me this 10th September 1839

Menard or his giving, leaving and taking the Oath according to Law
