I, Jacob Mook of Lelaworth E. County of Breckinridge State of Kentucky, being of Sound and disposing Mind and Memory Gamined, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament

First I desire all my just and Lawfull debts, and funeral Expenses paid by my Executor. Second, I will and bequeath to my beloved ^{Wife} Harriet Mook all the Household and Kitchen Furniture for her own use and benefit. And it is my Will and desire that my Wife Harriet be allowed to keep the Dwelling House and so much of the Ground ^{as} will not be required to be sold for the Maintenance of herself and my bodily Heirs. Provided however that if there should not be a Sufficient income arising from the personal Estate and the other Real Estate to provide for their Maintenance then it is my Will and desire that my Executor hereinafter named be empowered to sell the aforesaid Residence and purchase one of less value for their use and benefit, and invest the balance in good Bonds, and the Interest arising from said Bonds, paid to her ^{several} Annual for the use and benefit of herself and Children so long as she remains my Widow. But provided she again Marry, I then desire the entire income of the Estate with the rent of the aforesaid Dwelling House to be appropriated to the Education and Maintenance of my bodily Heirs.

Lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my friend John W. Raitt as Executor of this my last Will and Testament, with full power to carry out the provisions thereof with powers to sell and convey all Real Estate that may be necessary to sell and convey and hereby revoking all other Wills by me made or purporting to have been made

I, Robert McGarock of the County of Breckinridge & State
of Kentucky, being in good health, both calling to mind the
uncertainty of this life & willing to dispose of what remain of
my worldly Estate, do make & publish this my last will, as follows
Item 1st I give & devise to my Son Randal H. McGarock & his
assigns forever 200 Acres of Land, lying on Honey Locust Creek in the
County of Hancock, being the same on which he now resides, to be
laid off, so as to include his improvements this is done to make his
portion equal with his brothers, all of whom except Francis F. the youngest
sons have received 200 Acres of Land or its equivalent in Money
Item 2^d I give & devise to my Son Francis F. McGarock (at the death
of myself & wife & his assigns forever 300 Acres of Land lying on Honey
Locust Creek, in the County of Breckinridge State of Kentucky, to be
laid off, so as to include the Homestead & all valuable improvements
200 Acres of which is devised to him to make his portion equal with
his brother & 100 Acres is given him to compensate him in part for
providing for Son Thomas orphan children & giving him a home
in his family until they marry. I bequeath him also all the
Stock on the Farm (the Hides, the Work Ox & one Saddle Mare & Sept 2^d)
also all the farming utensils & one half the Household & Kitchen
Furniture, & the residue of my Estate I reserve for the use of
myself & wife during our natural lives & at our death, to
be equally divided amongst all of our children, to wit, Randal
H. McGarock, Jacob McGarock, Thomas H. McGarock, John C.
McGarock, James H. McGarock, Gordon C. McGarock, John B. McGarock
& Francis F. McGarock, lastly I nominate & appoint my Sons —
Randal H. John H. & Francis F. McGarock Executors of this my Will.
hereby annulling & revoking all other Wills, by me heretofore made or
published, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& Seal this 3^d day of March in the Year 1866
