Witnesseth that the party of the first part Aron K. Norton considering this life uncertain and being of sound mind and memory and by these presents do make good all his claims on his personal property to his brother James A. Norton of the second part to wit

his interest in the land that was deeded to them as Aron K. Norton and James A. Norton in the year 1885 by Kellogg Norton & Elsie Norton also one bay mare and one yoke of young oxen for which I Aron K. Norton do this day will all the above named property to James A. Norton to have and to hold as his own with the right to trade and make transfers as suits the party of the second part for which the party of the second is to pay all debts that is against the party of the first and to care for him as long as he lives and also pay his burial expences and also to take good care of Kellogg & Elsie Norton his parents and his two sisters Laura Paul and Anna Norton as long as they remain single and live with him this
