Examined I James R Robertson of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do make the following disposition of my real and personal estate I wish a sufficient amount of my personal property sold to pay all my debts and the remainder of my personal property and all of my landed estate is to be held by and to belong to my wife Lucretia A Robertson until my youngest son Lewis Robertson arrives at the age of twenty one years at which time an equal division is to be made of my real estate between my four children to wit, Jessie A Bates Thomas V Robertson Marcella Robertson and Lewis Robertson the three last named children is to have one horse, one cow and calf and one bed each to make them equal with my daughter Jessie A Bates nothing in the above arrangement is to be so construed as to affect in any way my wife Lucretia A Robertsons legal dower

I Whereas I am now in bad health and do not know what may be the result of my sickness and being desirous to make a disposition of my property different from that made by law do make & ordain this my last will & testament

First I desire that any debts I may be owing at my death if any they are but small should be first paid

After the payment of my debts &c I devise to my cousin John Haffey \$200. he is living in Henderson County Ky. One hundred dollars to the widow & children of my cousin Patrick Haffey who live in Ireland

To my sister Margaret Knight living in Logansport Indiana Seven hundred dollars

I further devise to my wife Susan A. all the rest and residue of my estate real personal & mixed property including stocks merchandise cash notes & accounts and all choses in action of every kind & description to have & to hold the same to her & her heirs forever The specific devise above named to wit to John Haffey to the widow & children of Patrick Haffey and to Margaret Knight not to be paid until 6 months after my death

I hereby make & constitute my wife Susan A Haffey executor of this will and as my debts are few & small I request she may not be required to give surety for the discharge of her duties as executor An testimony whereof
