for the ample and comfortable support of my wife during
her life my Executor exercising their discretion in apportioning
the amount necessary for this purpose. And furthermore I wish
my Executor before the final division to reserve such an amount
from my estate as may be necessary to educate my children
giving each one a good education

I hereby appoint Thomas J. Owen and Wm. Norman
my Executors hereby empowering them to sell and convey
such of property as may be sold together with all other
power necessary to the Executors of this foregoing one or
both hereby authorized to carry out the provisions of this
will. Having full confidence in the before named Executors
I hereby request that they may be allowed to execute the provisions
of the foregoing without giving security for the performance
of the same This 19th day of June 1857

Now James A. Hamilton Esq. Residing Judge Breckinridge County Ky.
The above and foregoing Writing purporting to be the last will & testament of
Jonathan C. Elliott deceased was produced in Court and was duly sworn by the
oath of Jefferson Jennings and William Singleton the Subscribing Witnesses
themselves. Who solemnly swear that the said testator Jonathan C. Elliott
executed and published the said writing in their presence as his
last will and testament and that they subscribed their names
as witnesses thereto in the presence of the testator and in the presence
of each other and that they believed the said testator was of sound
mind and disposing memory at the time of executing and
publishing said will. The said witnesses further swore that the
said testator died in this county and that he had property here at
the time. It is therefore adjudged by the court that said writing is
duly proven and is hereby established as the last will & testament of
Jonathan C. Elliott. His executors Thomas Glavin and William
Merriman the executors named in said will came in Court and
took the oath required by Law and letters of Probate is granted them
as executors. The said testator having in his said will dis^{posed} of his
property. The said Thomas Glavin and William Merriman as
executors executed the covenant conditioned agreeably to Law.
And it was therefore ordered that said last will be recorded
and leave was given the said executors to withdraw the original
will for probate & record in ^{the most} proper of the testator's property
