Know all men by these presents, that I John Brimmer being in full health, but of sound mind and disposing memory, Make this my last will and Testament after paying all my Just debts, and funeral expenses I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Cassandra Brimmer for her support and maintenance during this life or widowhood all my personal property of whatever kind, and the tract of land on which I now reside, and which was deeded to me by my Father Leonard Brimmer, At the death of my wife, I will and bequeath these all my personal property, their remainings, and the increase, to be equally divided between my five children, George Conrad Charolsta, John & Cyrus and having heretofore given and conveyed to my two sons George and Conrad each a tract of land - I now give and bequeath to my son John a tract of Land, willed to me by my Father, Leonard Brimmer, and a tract of Land conveyed to me by Solomon Perrins, except that part heretofore conveyed to George, and except also a small piece of some two or three acres lying between the home place, on which I reside and that conveyed to George, which is to go with the home tract, I will and bequeath to my son George in trust for Cyrus, at the death of my wife, the tract of land on which I now reside, and which I have herein before given to my wife, during her life, It is my will and intention that the property herein given to my son Cyrus, both real and personal, shall be held by George in trust for him during his life, and at his death to his lawful children if any if none, then to my other children herein named and their heirs, the trustee or a Court of Equity may make or convey, a sale of any of said property and reinvest the proceeds in real estate or some safe & profitable business, or loan it out, at interest, whenever it shall clearly appear to said trustee or Court, that it is to the interest of Cyrus, to do so, my intention being that nothing shall be used except rents & profits, and that only for his support, unless it should become necessary, to use other portions, of the property, for his maintenance, My executor herein after named, may at any time, whenever in his judgment, it becomes necessary to preserve my estate, from waste or destruction, sell or dispose of any of my personal property, herein mentioned, raising and making such disposition of the proceeds of said property, as in his judgment will be best calculated, to preserve and increase my estate, It is my desire and request that my sons deal liberally with their sister and see that she has a comfortable support, out of my estate, I nominate and appoint my son Geo. P. Brimmer, my executor, and leaving full confidence in him give him full and ample power, to execute and carry out then my last will and Testament, and request the Court not to require security,
