Examined I John Dymott of Buchanan County Kentucky being sound in mind and of disposing Memory but in feeble health And far Advanced in life do make and establish this my last will and Testament revoking all other Wills

First I desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid 2nd I will and devise my Yellow man Johnson to my son Andrew R. Dymott (he) Andrew is to take said Johnson at his Valuation and account for it to my estate after deducting said Andrews share or portion of my estate out of the Value of said Slave Johnson 3rd it is my will and desire that my old Black Woman Celia may have the privilege of choosing which of my Children she will live with and to be taken at the Valuation which is to be accounted for in the settlement of & distribution of my estate 4th it is my will and desire that my black girl Susan who is affected with Venereal shall not be disposed of for one year after my death if she shall live so long but shall go with Celia and my Executors hereinafter named shall have Medical Attention given her said evidence to have her cured paying all necessary expenses for her out of my estate and then dispose of her by letting one of my Children have her upon such terms as they may think best 5th I will and devise to my daughter Lucy Clarkson One Dollar I having advanced to her her full share of my estate 6th it is my will & desire that my executors sell all of my personal property on such a credit as they may deem best for the advantage of my estate 7th it is my will and desire that my Executors sell and dispose of the farm on which I now live either privately or publicly upon such credits as they may think right & proper 8th it is my will and desire that after paying my funeral expenses & just debts and expenses arising out of the settlement of my estate and the devise of this Will that the net & residue of my estate be equally divided as follows (viz) To James Dymott One sixth part to Daniel Dymott One sixth part to George Dymott One sixth part to Andrew R. Dymott One sixth part to Susan Pate One sixth part And to Judith Miller One sixth part 9th I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son Andrew R. Dymott & my son in Law Thomas Miller Executors of this my last Will and Testament 10th it is my will and desire that my said executors or the acting or surviving convey the lands on which my farm and houses are & desired to be sold by this Will also that they or either of them convey any & all lands that I ought or could have conveyed if living in testimony whereof I have set my hand & seal this 4th day of July 1853
