to be my last will and Testament
that I do say, First, after all my
debts are paid and discharged
the residue of my estate real and
personal I give bequeath and dis-
pose of as follows (viz) to my be-
loved wife the land, and all the
appurtenances situated thereon,
known as the old Mike Graze farm
lying and being in the County of
Breckenridge and State of Ken-
tucky, to have and to hold, and dis-
pose of in any way she may think
best for her support during her
natural life, and at her death she
may, as dispose of the residue in
any way she may think best.
Likewise I make constitute and
appoint Fred Graze and A. K.
Whites Executors of this my last
will and Testament hereby revoke
ing all former wills made by me
and giving said Executors full
power to make deeds to lands that
are now sold, or may be hereafter
sold, and shall be as binding
as though I was living.
