It is further my will and desire that my son Mount Clinton be my executor to my last will and testament as follows my house this day of September and thousand eight hundred and forty one in person of N.B. also I give to beloved wife one third of the earnings which my children for my slaves during.

I John Glopcock Sr. of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky, being in my right mind & sound do declare and make this my last will and testament to wit I give I bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the last place where I was taken I give I bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Glopcock my whole estate during her natural life then after her death as follows I give I bequeath to my beloved son John O.B. Glopcock the following property to wit two negro boys and named Harrison & the other Blay and also the child that my negro woman Joyce is with at this time to be his during his life time and then to be divided to his children I give I bequeath to my son in law John H. Bailey and the heirs of William Glopcock my son now deceased my negro woman Joyce and her heirs if any after the and above named to be equally divided and half to go to John H. Bailey and the other half to William Glopcock's heirs I give I bequeath to my son John O.B. Glopcock at the death of my wife Mary all my house hold & kitchen furniture & personal effects in fact all my property except the above named woman lastly I name my son John O.B. Glopcock Executor to my will as follows my hand and Seal this 20th day of April 1842.

I Stephen Pelly Pool of Buckeye County & State of Kentucky knowing
that it is agreed that at even must die do make this my last will and testament
in manner following: I give to my beloved wife Margaret Pool
my two black sons Bob & Stephen and my two black women Rachel and
Henny and my black girl Annice and all my personal property during
her natural life and after her death the slaves and their increase & what ever
of the personal property may be remaining I wish to be equally divided
amongst my heirs but with this proviso, it is my wish that after the death
of my wife that the negro woman Rachel shall have her personal liberty
and if she is unable to maintain her self I wish her maintained out of
my estate but should she the said Rachel have any children after the
death of my wife such increase is not to be free but is to be shared as
their mother was not liberated this clause is not intended to emancipate
Rachel but to exonerate her from serving any one 2^d I give & bequeath
to my daughter Patsy Williams her heirs for ever one black girl named
Levinia and all her children 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Edwige
Williams her heirs for ever one black girl named Wadley her children
4th I give to my grand son Lottelin Pool son of John Pool dec^d one black
girl named Mopsy and one hundred dollars out of my estate and as
much which 100 dollars is to be due to him at the death of my wife and
should my said grand son Lottelin Pool die with out children the negro
girl Mopsy and the 100 dollars herein devised to him is to be given back to my
estate and to be divided among my children 5th I give and bequeath to my
daughter Peggy Hayden and her heirs for ever one Mule but named
Martha 6th I give and bequeath to my son Sanford P Pool and his
heirs for ever one black boy named Tom and all the tract of land he now
lives on except the part I have to Elijah Board 7th I give and bequeath
to my son William P Pool one black boy named Henry to him &
his heirs for ever and as I have given to my sons Sanford and William
more of my estate than their equal parts they are to pay to my Grand Son
Lottelin Pool the one hundred dollars devised to him.
8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty P Pool one black girl
named Caroline to her and her heirs for ever and when as I have
some small negroes not mentioned in the will which I intend
to be dividing among my children before my death but should I
not distribute them before I die, I wish them equally divided
among my children now living & further when they or any three devise
to my heirs and to be divided after my death I wish the division made
in the following manner I do not wish them sold to Speculators or
Wharves, I wish them sold to the highest bidder amongst my
children on a credit of 12 months & the money divided I appoint
my son Sanford P Pool and William P Pool Executors of this my
last will and testament Testing at former Will. as witness my
