I John Graze of the County of Breck-
inridge and State of Ky. calling to
mind the uncertainty of life and the
certainty of death do make this my
last will and testament.
1st I wish I desire all my just debts
paid.
2nd I desire and equal division of all
of my property between all of my
children except Ben and Henry they
have got there part in the farm
and I desire to have there part of there
mother's share and one share of my
estate besides and I appoint Henry
Graze guardian for Margret's
children and Ben for Eliza's
children. And I have paid Eliza's
one hundred dollars which is to be

459 I wanted out of their share, Henry and
Ben to receive the part of Margaret
+ Eliza and to pay it out to their
children when they come of age. I
want Eliza to be guardian for the 2
young share and to take and keep it
till they be come of age and to take
them all as and to be allowed fifty
dollar a year till they are 12 years
old, if he wont take them Sabel
Combs is to take them and be allow-
anced the same. I have given my
son William a cow for Margaretta
which he is to give her when she needs
her and I want Margaret to have
the best cow I have and to go with
them, and a head and branding, to
be set on the place, a sufficient to
keep them warm any cold night.
I want my administration I want the
children to put and Ezra and
George, my two old sons to divide
it according to this my last will
and testament.
