Know all men by these presents that I John Harwood of the County of Providence and State of Rhode Island do make and establish this my last will and Testament saying
1st I will and bequeath to Lucy M. Morrison my lot, lotbook & building and Sixty Dollars in Money.
2^d I will and bequeath to Samuel M. Morrison and Eliza both S. Morrison each one hundred Dollars in Money.

3^d I will and bequeath to Eliza both Sons Lucy Parker Bennett the Harwood William Harwood and the Children of Maria Erickson each one hundred Dollars.
4th I will and bequeath the residue of my estate of every description to John M. Morrison to be paid to him, with the interest accruing thereon. When he has arrived at the age of twenty-one years, and I do hereby appoint John M. Morrison to act as his guardian in the premises and desires that no Security shall be required of him.

5th It is the expressed intent of John M. Morrison should die before he arrives at 21 years of age, it is my Will and desire, that such portion of my estate as would have fallen to him, under the last clause, shall then be equally divided between the above named Lucy M. Morrison and Samuel M. and Eliza both S. Morrison.

6th I constitute and appoint John M. Morrison Executor of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have signed this 18th day of May 1857.
