I do will and bequeath to my sister

her eight children all of my land
in Breckinridge County Ky. it being
the land on which I now live on the
North fork of Irish Creek and all
other property notes and money that
I now have in possession of at my
death to the said Lydia Ann
Cannon and her eight children
forever. With this proviso that said
Lydia Ann Cannon and her eight
children properly support and take
proper care of my sister Eliza Early
during her natural life. Provided
said sister will live with them and
if not they are not hereby bound
to give her any part of said land
or property. I do hereby appoint
Lydia Ann Cannon my Executrix to
this my last will and do not
require security to said Lydia Ann
Cannon as witness whereof I sign
my name &c.
