1st I bequeath my soul to God who gave it

2nd I will and give all I have both real and personal to my two children to wit: Maria M. Morris and Darius Morris their husbands one half of the estate and John L. McCubbin Jr one half equal part of the property both real and personal that I may have at my death.

3rd It is my Will that my beloved wife is to be taken care of comfortably by them the said John L. & Maria M. Morris during her life.

4th I Will that the said John L. McCubbin and Darius Morris be appointed my executors to carry out this my last Will and testament.

5th I Will that they pay all my just debts and pay funeral expenses ^{out} of the estate.

One Gray horse to be excepted from this will & to belong to my wife after my death.
