In witness whereof I have signed and sealed and published and Declared this instrument as my will at my residence in the County and State aforesaid.

The said John Rhodus at his residence signed and sealed the instrument and published and declared the same as and for his last will, and we at his request and in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto written our names as subscribing witnesses.
