 will not require her to give security. I desire that she shall pay my just
 debts & to do so in the purpose of carrying out effect this will she is
 authorized to sell & dispose of any of my estate, made & published as my
 last will & Testament this 2nd day of October 1841 in presence of
 William Lewis & John H. String

I do hereby certify that I have been duly advised of my approaching dissolution by the
 intimacies of my body & property as I do the full extent exercise of all my
 intellectual faculties with all the soundness or sanity of mind that I can
 I engaged at any proceeding proved of my existence do in these present
 proceed to make the following disposition of my property to my wife and
 amongst my children (viz) It is my will & desire that all just debts and demands
 against me shall be fully discharged out of my estate

2nd It is my desire that my wife Mary Sally shall have & hold the remaining
 part of my estate both personal & real to manage in what manner she
 may deem most conducive to the benefit of herself & my children by her
 investing & requiring her at the same time to give to the children if any
 of them should marry & have her a dowry & her wedding & should her
 circumstances admit of her so doing; the above named estate I will &

begeth to her for life time or during her natural life & it is my will &
 desire that at the death or expiration of her natural life the property or estate
 begeth to my wife shall descend to my children by her which property I will
 & begeth to them their heirs forever wishing said children that I have &
 enjoy an equal portion of my estate but it is my will & desire that my friend
 John D. Bennett shall be the executor of this my last will & testament in
 witness whereof I set his name with my hand & seal

I John O. Gregory of the County of Buchanan & State of Ky being
 now in good health but of sound mind & disposing memory & knowing the
 nature of life & the certainty of death & believing it to be the duty of every man
 to make such a disposition of his temporal affairs as he may desire to take
 place after his death. I do therefore make this my last will & testament as
 follows (viz) I do hereby devise that if my estate and household & living furniture
 shall be given to John Minor, P. O. Son of Louisa P. O. daughter of George
 P. O. the money is to be sent to S. M. P. O. five years after my death & to
 bear interest from that date until he becomes twenty and years of age
 & when in the 5th S. M. P. O. dies before he arrives to the age of twenty and, then
 the money shall go to those who have the balance of my estate each their
 proportionable part to be in a card and with the amount allowed them
 with W. S. Gregory who gets but the \$100. but my son the S. M. Gregory
 I do give thirty five dollars to be due her in eight years from the day of my death
 also to John O. Gregory son of Wm. Gregory I do give twenty five dollars
 and in five years after my death & unto Minor S. Gregory I do give one
 hundred dollars a part of my interest in a house & lot in Constantin
 that he purchased of Wm. & Brown & after all my part of the house & lot
 is paid, I do give unto William G. Gregory & Sally his wife the same
 interest of my estate equally divided among them & I do here by appoint
 William G. Gregory Executor of this my will & as I have more money
