and declare this my last Will and Testament, hereby
revoking and making null and void all former
Wills and Testaments and Writings in the nature of
last Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made

My Will is first that my funeral Charges and
Just debts shall be paid by my Executor hereafter
named

The Residue of my Estate and property which —
shall not be required for the payment of my Just
debts, funeral Charges and the expenses attending
the execution of this my last Will and the Adminis-
tration of my estate, I give and bequeath, devise
and dispose of as follows. To Wit, I give and devise
to my beloved Wife, Nancy Sawyer, all and
singular my household, Furniture not otherwise
hereinafter disposed of — I do also bequeath to the
said Nancy Sawyer — The House and lot and
apartments thereunto belonging in the town of
Crownpoint, Breckinridge County State of Kentucky
situate on High Street on the North West by the Clam
Creek Street, and Called first Cross Street —
Containing 115 ft 4 in. One hundred and fifteen feet
four inches front by (20) deep one hundred & twenty
feet deep, being the same property long used by
me as a family residence — and where I now reside
at the time of the sealing of this my Will — also
I give and bequeath to the said Nancy Sawyer
my Wife — besides the above reservations — separate
and apart, an Equal share of the of the residue
of my property Bonds Mortgages and whatever good
& Chances Wares and Merchandise now or hereafter
may accrue and which I may be seized of at
my demise, Share and share alike — with my
Children, Isabella Howell, Amelia Jane Cowden
Thomas H. Sawyer & — Frances his Wife their heirs
forever — during her natural life, After which to be
equally divided Among my three Children named
above

I also Will to my Wife Nancy Sawyer the Wages and
Services arising from my two — Apprentices, George and
Isaac (Colored) until they arrive at the age of twenty
one years at the end of the expiration of their indentures
The said George and Isaac — to be provided with a good
suit of cloths at a cost of fifteen dollars each and
thirty (30) dollars each in money the Currency of the
Country — San Francisco I Will and bequeath to the

Lawyer now in the State of California * * * Wife of my
son Thomas (provided said Children shall be called
after me and my name - given to him - duly Christian
or baptiz'd under the law) My Gold Watch bearing
the following inscription, "Presented by The Louisville
Fire and Marine Insurance Company to Capt Jonathan
Lawyer as a testimonial for his skill and exertions
in saving from loss - the Steamer New Jersey after
she had been smugged and sunk on the Mississippi
River in the Year 1831" With the foot Chain Chunks
attached -

the youngest Child of 1st Frances by Thomas Sawyer
is of lawful age.
