

The last will and Testament of Joseph Fackler of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, I Joseph Fackler considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first I Give And devise to my said second son Joseph Fackler his heirs and assigns all my Mesuages or Tenements situated lying and being in the County of of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky on the waters of Sugarbush run together with all my other freehold estate whatsoever to hold to him the said son Joseph his heirs and assigns forever and hereby Give and bequeath to my said Younger son Jacob Fackler Twelve Hundred dollars to be paid ^{four} ~~one~~ Year from date,

I make my son Joseph sole executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made My other Children having received their proportion allotted for them, hereby revoking all former wills by me made in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eight day of May one thousand eight hundred sixty seven - May the 8th 1867
