In the name of God Amen, I Joseph Butcheridge or Hudson now living of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky being Weak in body but of sound mind and memory with thanks to God for all his mercies calling to mind the uncertainty of mortal life and knowing that it is appointed for all mankind once to die then to appear before the Judge sitting my temporal affairs to make and ordain this present Testament of my body my last will and testament in manner & form following to wit That I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried when I have departed this world by many friends I should like at my present place of abode or convenient thereto and to be buried in a plain and common way I wish as superfluous around about my old earthly Cargol like to gather into dust I wish my Executive and Executor to adhere to this request where names will hereafter be mentioned I solemnly do declare the absolutely free and chaste and in law I shall please here to and do not wish both before and personal my will is that they be disposed of in the manner and form following to wit as my deceased wife Hannah Butcheridge or Hudson I have and do hereby bequeath all my Estate both real and personal for during her natural life time only subject to the discharging funeral charges and just debts I wish no appraisement on the estate but for a sale unless by her consent for her support and as there is no just debt due to my wife she would be well supplied in clothing a small estate I wish that immediately after the decease of my wife Hannah that a sale be made agreeable to law of said estate and the fourth amount of said estate be equally divided amongst our children together with her said Hannah only having two dollars each for the use of my first wife Hannah's children if demanded not in less than twelve nor more than eighteen months from the date of the above property my wish is likewise that our two daughters Eliza and Mary remain to live with their mother as long as they remain single by her consent & withy I constitute and ordain my wife Hannah Butcheridge or Hudson Executive and her brother John Ball of West County Kentucky Executor of this my last will and testament and heavily testifying and depaunting all and every other former will and declare that to be my last will. Lang considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind & memory (Witness to be slightly God to the same) do make this my last Will and Testament in a manner & form following (Wiz) I first I commend my body to the good and my Soul to God who gave it I then devise my funeral expenses to be paid and I desire that all my just shall be paid if there is property enough belonging to my estate to do it exclusive of what the law allows my wife and children there to more than will satisfy those debts I desire it to be distributed equally among my children for their education or in what ever way my wife Elizabeth Ann & Stephen McCracken may think proper and I hereby appoint Stephen McCracken and my wife Elizabeth Ann in conjunction Executors & Executive of this my last Will and Testament here by revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 25th day March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty two 1842
