I Josiah Robbins of the county of Brockbridge State of Kentucky, being of sound mind but infirm health and viewing the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and Testament as follows
It is my desire to be interred with my beloved wife Mahala with as little expense as possible and as near to home as near like the one I procured to be placed at any info given to be procured & placed at my grave and I desire my Executor to settle all legally proven accounts or debts coming against the Estate after my decease

To my eldest son Linis I bequeath the sum of twenty dollars from age of 16 I bequeath to him the sum of twenty dollars, considering that that will make him equal with his younger Brothers and sister who are yet to raise and educate.

To my second son Charles I bequeath the sum of twenty dollars over and above his indentments to the Estate

To my only daughter Ann I bequeath the sum of fifty dollars in consideration of her repeated acts of kindness during my protracted illness

To my fourth son Nathan I bequeath the sum of fifty dollars in consideration of his youth and inexperience and that he was good assistance while young with no parents to care for and provide for him

To my fifth son Thomas I bequeath Sixty dollars in consideration of the same reasons

To my sixth son William Isaac I bequeath One hundred dollars in consideration his extreme youth and delicate constitution And to my beloved children William Robbins Ann Robbins Nathan B Robbins Thomas Robbins and William Jesse Robbins I will and bequeath the balance of my estate to be equally divided between them to it more or less

It is my desire that my Executor James H. Cunningham dispose of my real and personal Estate either privately or publicly as soon as practicable after my decease to the best advantage

And it is my desire that my Executor should communicate with my Father Linis Robbins and Brother Lemm Robbins who reside in Union Sicily, ^{County} State of Maine immediately after my decease and inform them that my children are left orphans without any one to care for and admonish them and that it is my wish that they should be placed under the supervision of their Grand Parents or Uncle and that Brother Lemm Robbins or Brother Nathan Robbins be constituted Guardian for Ann Robbins Nathan Robbins Thomas Robbins and Isaac Robbins And further that my Executor immediately after the coming of Brother Linis Robbins or Nathan Robbins to take the above named children, under his guidance or care or as soon thereafter as he possibly can pay unto the said, Lemm or Nathan Robbins the sum or amount due and

and bequeathed to them for their support and Education to be expended by said Guardian as he may deem expedient for their benefit.

And further I desire my executor after he has settled up the Estate and determined what amount will be left and it being to pay the same to him without reference to his minority believe him capable of taking as good care of it as a Guardian taking his receipt in presence of witnesses which shall ever exonerate my Executor from liability.

And further in case either of my brothers come for and remove the above named children then my Executor shall pay over to either or both in case they should come the amounts above specified or ascertained taking his or their receipt which shall from release him from future liability.
