In the name of God I George Anderson being of sound mind and of perfect memory do make and constitute this my last last Will and Testament revoking all others that is to say I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susannah Anderson head of household whom I now live with the ~~foregoing~~ <sup>entire</sup> thereof and after her death to belong to my only and well beloved son William Anderson I also give to my wife and my son William the old black horse and cow and mare at their value to be accounted for in the 1<sup>st</sup> Susannahs legal part of my personal property according to law I also have given to my beloved daughter Margaret Kent one mare worth fifty dollars and twenty five dollars worth of other property which she is to account for to my estate and where Sally Philips has one sixty five dollars including twenty three dollars fifty cents worth of property also my beloved daughter Nancy Anderson shall receive sixty five dollars also my beloved daughter Sally Anderson shall receive sixty five dollars also my beloved daughter Elizabeth Anderson shall receive sixty five dollars and if any surplus the balance be divided equally between my four daughters which above named also I make and constitute the honorable Court of Buchanan County Kentucky my executor given under my hand and sealed with my seal this 23<sup>d</sup> day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine

I Joseph Oglesby of Nelson County and State of Kentucky Calling to mind the mutability of all flesh and being weak of body but sound in mind and perfectly in my senses do make constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in the manner of and following

That it is my Will and desire that after my death all my just debts shall be paid and then what shall please the Lord to bestow on me both real and personal Estate shall remain in the possession of my beloved wife Ann Ogilby as a loan during her natural life. Should she be a longer liver than myself and after our separation from this life what of my estate then remaining to be greatly divided among my children Margaret Ogilby Joseph W. Ogilby Anne Redman Lucy a child of an Amos Atkinson William Ogilby Betty Atkinson and Mahala Ogilby with exception that the last mentioned Mahala Ogilby is to have first one and above her equal part of the balance of my Estate but should she die without an heir then it is to be taken to the estate. It is further my desire that my beloved wife Ann Ogilby shall act as executrix to this Will.

I John Fisher of the County of Buckenridge and State of Maryland being asked in body test of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following First it is my Will that the debts <sup>due</sup> to me be collected and applied to the discharge of the debts I owe as far as the same may be money. Second it is my Will that my wife Anne retain & enjoy the full possession use and profits of my whole Estate real and personal during her widowhood with such exceptions only as are herein after mentioned for the purpose of her proper support and <sup>for the</sup> training and education of my children. 3. At her decease or in case of her marrying it is my Will that the estate both real & personal then remaining be disposed of & distributed according to the basis of the land each child being charged in said distribution with what they may have raised above their education & maintenance. I hereby appoint my Brother Gilbert Fisher and David W. Mason the Executors of this my last Will and Testament with power to act jointly and severally in the execution of the same. It is my Will that my executors do to each of my children upon their Marriage or coming of age One Acre with such other property or money as may amount in the whole to the sum of One Hundred Dollars
