Examined Ky and county Breckinridge being weak in body but of sound
mind and disposing memory do hereby make the following
disposition of my property both real and personal viz.
First it is my will that all necessary funeral expenses shall
be paid

Second the tract of land purchased of Ed Buren & Son lying
on Flint Island is bequeathed to W. F. Pike upon the condi-
tions that said W. F. Pike shall execute his notes to J. H. Pike
for the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid as follows
\$200.00 at the expiration of two years \$200.00 at expiration three
years \$100.00 in four years said notes are to be written so as to
retain lien upon the land for surety of payment and are to bear
interest from date I also bequeath to W. F. Pike a certain tract
of land lying on the Kentucky side of the chute bounded as
follows To begin at the chute bank and follow the line between
me and John Gillispie to the top of the first bluff from the
river to a point where the wagon road turns suddenly down
the hill to the left then follow the margin of this bluff to the
line between me and what used to be the Henry Burch
tract of land thence with that line to the chute and up
the chute to the beginning

Thirdly I bequeath all the balance of my real estate jointly to
my wife Esabella Pike and daughter Emma Bryan and ^{at her} death
of my wife her interest shall revert to my daughter Emma
O'Bryan they also shall be required to execute joint notes payable to J. H.
Pike for the sum of five hundred dollars \$200.00 to be paid in two years
\$200.00 at expiration three years and the remaining \$100.00 in four years
Said notes are to be written so as to retain lien on said land for surety of
payment and shall bear interest from date I believe that is sufficient
personal property in my possession to liquidate my indebtedness
but in case it should fall short it is my will that the por-
ties to whom I have bequeathed my land shall pay the deficiency
or It is my desire and I will that Ed Pike my niece
is to be paid the sum of one hundred dollars and it
is also my will that Ed Pike my nephew shall have
the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars provided he
returns to his work the 1st of May and continues until
Nov. 25 1888 It is my will that all the available means shall

be gotten together by the end of this year and all claims against me shall be paid and any property personal be left it must be equally divided among my three children

I hereby appoint S. H. Bryan as executor without security

If my Mother should survive me, I give in trust for her use and benefit all my real and personal estate of every kind which I now have or may hereafter acquire. The principal to be safely invested by my Executor in the most productive manner attainable and not in any event to be used. The proceeds arising thereon to go to my Mother Melvinia McGlothlan for her exclusive use and benefit and to be used by her as she may see proper to do. At my Mother's death all the real and personal estate that I have willed her the principal to remain a permanent fund and to be invested by a trustee appointed by the County Court in the most productive manner attainable. The interest to be used in aid and support of a Common School at Union Star Ky for the education of all the children of proper school age, in such Common School District as may include the town of Union Star Ky. If I should survive my Mother and die and leave no legal wife or legal bodily heirs, I give all my real and personal estate the principal to remain a permanent fund and be invested by a trustee appointed by the County Court in the most productive manner attainable. The interest to be used in aid and support of a Common School at Union Star Ky for the Education of all the children of proper school age, in such Common School District as may include the town of Union Star Ky. If I die and leave a legal wife or legal bodily heirs then this Will is null and void. I appoint Andrew Crawford, Esq. of Stephensport Ky my Executor and fix his Compensation for his services at three hundred dollars to be paid him out of my estate. When he makes his final Settlement of my estate with the County Court of Breckinridge County Ky
