

I, Martha J. Frank of the County of Breckinridge and Commonwealth of Kentucky, being through the goodness of Almighty God of sound mind and memory, but being aware of the uncertainty of human life, do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, that is to say first I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and desire that my body may be decently buried in the Farm in place as selected by me for my Family interment.

With respect to my worldly estate I give, bequeath and dispose of it in the following manner, after all my just and lawful debts are paid and discharged.

First. I give and bequeath to my son P. J. Frank, one Black Horse, choice milk cow, sow & pigs & Sheds which he now claims as his own, & all the Farming implements as long as he remains on the Farm, one Bed & Bed clothing.
Second. I give and bequeath to my son W. A. Frank one Horse 3 higgs, one Bed, the Ballance of my Beading to be equally divided between my 11 younger children.

I give and bequeath to my son Ch. C. Frank one hundred Dollars which he used in raising him if necessary if not that with the rest of my property & what is owing to me is to be equally divided between my six youngest children which is to be sold to the highest bidder except one half the Tobacco, corn and provision enough to last P. J. Frank, Twelve months also he has the use of W. A. Frank Horse, during the present cropping season John J. Crumpton & wife will take two of my daughters to raise, Mattie & Annie, Fred. Frazer & wife will take 3 of my children to raise, Willie, Eliza & Christopher, and lastly I do nominate and appoint my much respected Brother Fred. Frazer & James W. Parns as the Executors of this my last will and testament.

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & seventy seven.
