and I wish my wife Elender to have the use & benefit of all I possess during her
life and after her death an equitable division to be made of them in such a
manner that three only of my children to whom I have as yet given nothing
should claim a share my present property (viz Elizabeth Paul Nancy Sarah
Mary Lewis Lewis Mattingly & Thomas Mattingly & George Mattingly to whom I
acknowledge I have as yet given little or nothing) I do appoint them my two grand-
children Sarah and Mary Ann daughters of Mrs Mattingly in the number
of my present heirs & I make the two equal to one of my own children and
my father Mrs Mattingly one dollar. I think I have already done for the
rest of my children all that I can possibly do it is not in my power at present
to make a more equitable distribution thereof I hope that John Mattingly
Margaret Phoebe Mary Clark Zachariah Mattingly Edward Mattingly
will acknowledge that I have done a father's part by them already. But if
John Mattingly ^{only} but if should not think so I have him one dollar
This is the arrangement which I wish to take place after my death and I
wish my son George to be my executor to be kind and obedient to

1. I Philip Alexander make, ordain and establish this my last and testament
2. I make constitute and appoint my wife Francis W. Alexander my sole executrix to execute my said Will as here in after directed and exempt her from giving any bond or security whatever in capacity of my executrix.
3. I Will, bequeath and devise to my said wife the tract of land on which I now live and also my old servant man Anthony and also one third part of the balance of my real and personal estate which I now or may hereafter have during her life except my old servant man Anthony whom I devise to her absolutely to dispose of as she pleases and also the entire possession of all my estate real and personal during the minority of my sons or celibacy of my daughter or minority of my daughter.
4. I Will devise & bequeath to all my children share & share alike at the last and best of my estate real and personal to be added to them as follows to wit: It is my will and desire that each of my sons become of age my executrix deliver up to them their distributive share of my estate agreeable to this Will and it is my Will & desire that in all things to my daughter Francis Worth her distributive share under this my Will, that the advancement that I have hitherto made to her to wit of a Negro woman & girl to wit Malinda & Sylvia be taken and considered as a part of her share agreeable to their value at the time at the time I advanced them to her & her husband and it is my will and desire that her share be added in & the same I do hereby devise and bequeath to and vest in my sons Thomas and William and the survivors of them in trust for the use & benefit of her and her children and in case of death of either the aforesaid trust then & in that case I will and desire that my brother Gerard Alexander be associated as trustee with the survivor and in case of the death of both them he to be the sole surviving trustee.
5. I will and desire that as my daughter Francis become of age or marry that my executrix deliver to them their respective share of my estate agreeable to this Will.
6. I do make ordain and appoint my brother Gerard Alexander guardian of all my children during their minority.
7. I will and desire that distribution & allotment of my estate as before specified to my children shall be made by my brother Gerard Alexander & my friend Capt Nathan D. Anderson and the survivors of them whose
