I will and bequeath to William F Hoskinson my son one feather bed with quilts blanket sheet pillows bolsters and and bed stead the remainder of property to be equally divided among all my children after my burial expenses with other debts are paid.

In the name of God amen I, Thos. J. Lewis of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of mortal life do this day 6th of July in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred Eighty nine make this my will and Testament in manner following

First I here by constitute and appoint my son William C. Lewis as executor of my will and direct that he pay all of my just debts and funeral expenses

Second I will that my farm on which I reside shall be held and occupied jointly by my wife Eliza W. Lewis and my youngest son Edgar C. Lewis for their exclusive use and benefit for the term of ^{five} years and when the time of their joint occupancy shall expire then my wife is to have her dower in said farm and the remainder of said farm sold. Provided however if my wife determine at any time before or during the said occupancy of said farm she can take her dower.

Third I will that my wife and son Edgar shall have selected my set apart by my executor a sufficient amount of provisions and stock and farming implements and all necessary house hold goods and furniture also kitchen utensils and furniture in consideration of which they are to keep the farm in good repair for and during the term of said five years. Provided however that if my wife and son Edgar do not occupy the farm jointly as set forth in section second then that the said provisions stock and farming implements as directed to be set apart by my executor will be sold and the proceeds shared equally among the legatees.
