now on hand

3 I Will and bequeath to E W Jones as trustee for my wife Mary the
sum of Six Thousand Dollars Said Sum of Money to be invested by
said Trustee in good paying Stocks or Bonds or loaned to responsible par
- ties as said Trustee may think best and proper and the interest to be
paid to my wife during her life and at her death. I will & bequeath said
sum of Money to James McEans Alexander McEans Thomas McEans
Ida Jackson & Nettie Meador in Equal portions and said Trustee will
pay the same over to them as soon as possible after the death of my
wife

4th I have heretofore given to my sons Gabriel & John the sum of
Twenty Two Hundred Dollars each and to Equalize my Children
I now Will & bequeath to my daughters Ida & Nettie the sum of Twenty

- Two Hundred Dollars each
- 5th I will and desire that my Executor shall at such times & in such manner as he may deem best sell all of my real or personal property not specifically devised, and Convey the same
- 6th I will and devise to E W Jones my tract of land known as the Carlton Place containing about 100 acres lying partly in Hardin & Breckinridge Counties, or if he so desires it he can by paying Two Thousand Dollars to my estate have the Hall place instead of Carlton Place, which lies in Breckinridge County and contains about 300 acres
- 7th After the payment of my just debts and the special devises herein made I will and bequeath the balance of my estate to my four children Gabriel John Ida & Nettie in equal portions
- 8th I hereby appoint E W Jones my sole Executor & desire that he shall ^{qualify} act under this will both as Executor & Trustee without Bond or Security
