

The last Will and Testament of John S Pool of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky

I John S Pool being of Sound Mind and Memory and in view of the uncertainty of this mortal life I do Make and publish this my last will and testament in French and form following first and last I do bequeath unto my beloved wife Sally Ann Pool all my personal property and real Estate to have and to hold as long as she remains my widow or during her Natural life Not having remarried again then I do bequeath unto my elder daughter Elder Pool and to my younger daughter Abigail all the house hold estate and real estate to have and to hold in fee simple

And I hereby appoint my wife Sally Ann Pool Executor to settle all my Business that may remain unsettled for testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 1st day of January 1869

I Michael Flaker of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky being of Sound Mind and disposing Memory do Make publish and declare this to be my last Will and testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made

It is my Will and desire that after the payment of my funeral Expenses and just Satisfaction of my estate that personal and Money and Colours in Action I shall be disposed of and distributed as follows to wit

First I Give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Ann Brashar a portion of a tract of Land bought by me of William S D Smith and Lyngdon

the Waters of Indian Creek in Hancock County said portion of land is to contain Forty Acres and in the same land I this day leased to John Nicholas for a Term of two years. Said forty Acres of land is to be held by My daughter Julia Ann during her life and at her death to descend to Henry Nicholas Campbell by Mary Brashear

I second All the balance of My real and personal property of which I am Seized at the time of My demise I wish and desire to be divided equally between My Children if living or their Lawful heirs if dead Making all equal in My Estate excepting the heirs of Sarah Stephens second wife of Jesse Stephens said heirs having Received their full portion of My Estate during My life time

I herby I do hereby appoint as the Executors of this my Will My Friends John B. Dehaan and John N. Harts with full power to convey by deed any real Estate of which I may be seized at My demise to such persons as the same may be sold
