 Court by Judah Payne and was duly sworn by the
 Oath of John Davison to one of the subscribing
 witnesses thereto who swore that Moses Payne signed
 and acknowledged the said Writing to be his last
 will and Testament and that he believed the said
 Moses Payne was of sound mind and disposing
 memory at the time of his signing the same and
 that the other subscribing witness thereto was present
 when he acknowledged the same and he had
 not see Martin Purforn sign his name as one of
 the witnesses and it is ordered by the Court to be
 recorded
